



SEWING FOR BEGINNERS

This course is developed for people who have little or no sewing experience. You will develop new skills, meet like-minded people and make new friends in the process. The main focus of the sessions will be gaining skills and learning how to make repairs to buttons and zips, hems, patches on knees and elbows.

This course will include learning the parts of your machine and how to use its features. You will also learn about sewing equipment, their different uses and how to follow a pattern to make clothing for babies and children and simple home accessories or gifts.

Kay Porter is a volunteer who has a passion for sewing. As a previous business owner who developed and made costumes for her business, she has a wealth of skills and knowledge to share.

Participants will need to bring their sewing machine, items of clothing to repair and a basic sewing kit (list provided at enrolment). Some sewing materials may need to be purchased during the course such as zippers and needles but costs will be kept to a minimum.

This course is also the perfect introduction for those who wish to proceed to the SEAL Sewing Group which meets on the 2nd Wednesday of each month from 6.30 – 9.30pm.
